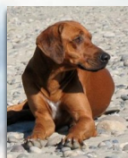

# The Problem

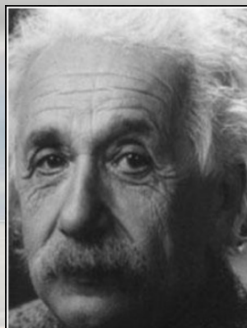
We are **forgiving** *structural flaws* for the sake of the ridge, when we should be **forgiving** *ridge*\* faults for the sake of structure.

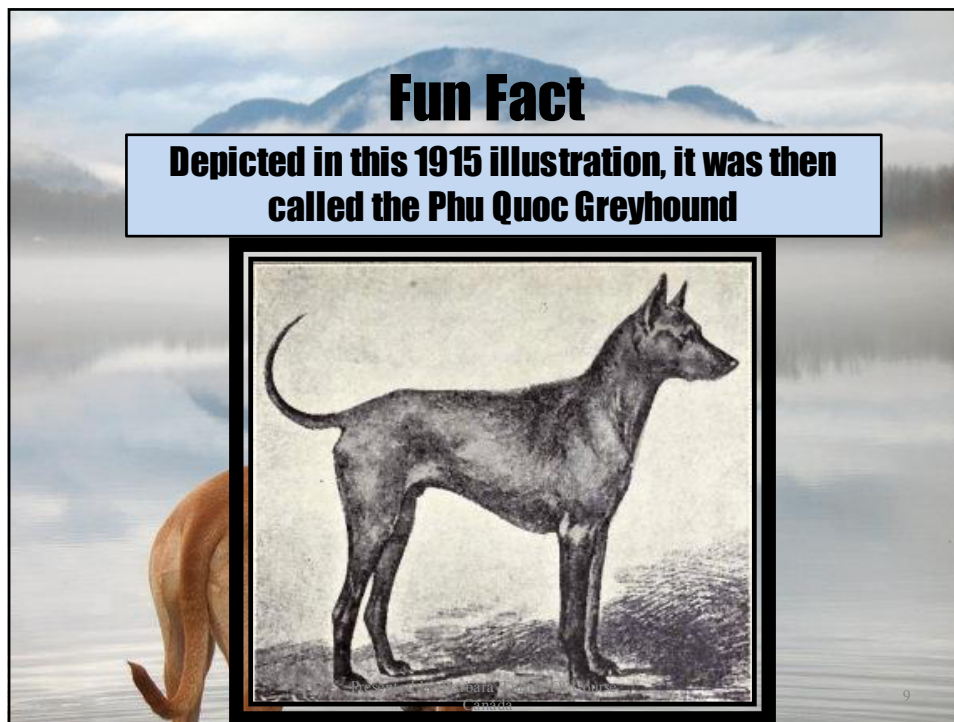

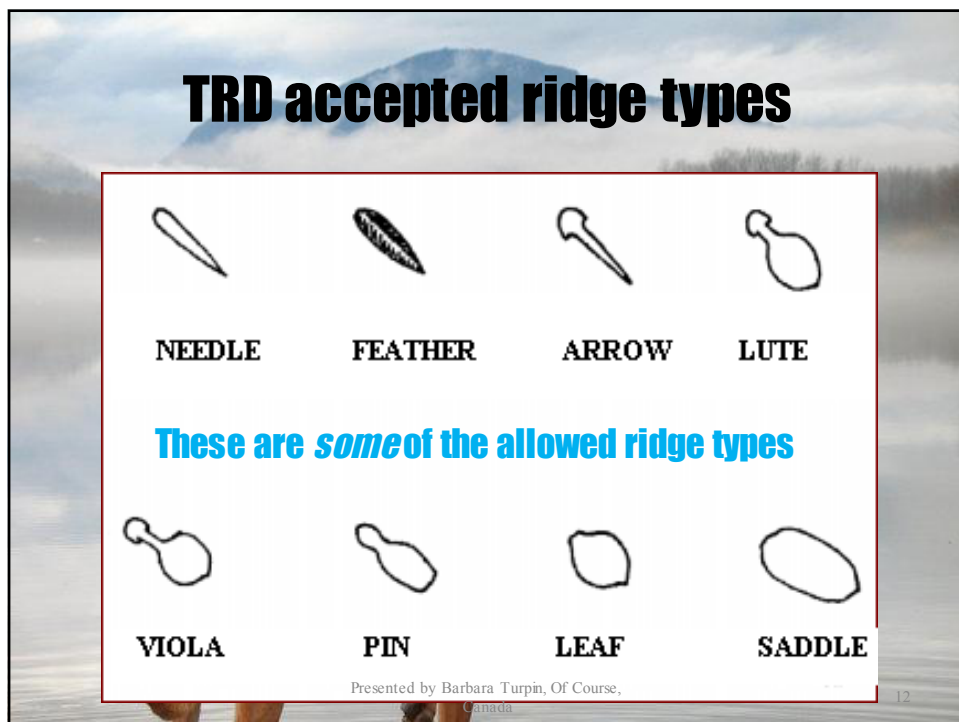










## Fun Fact

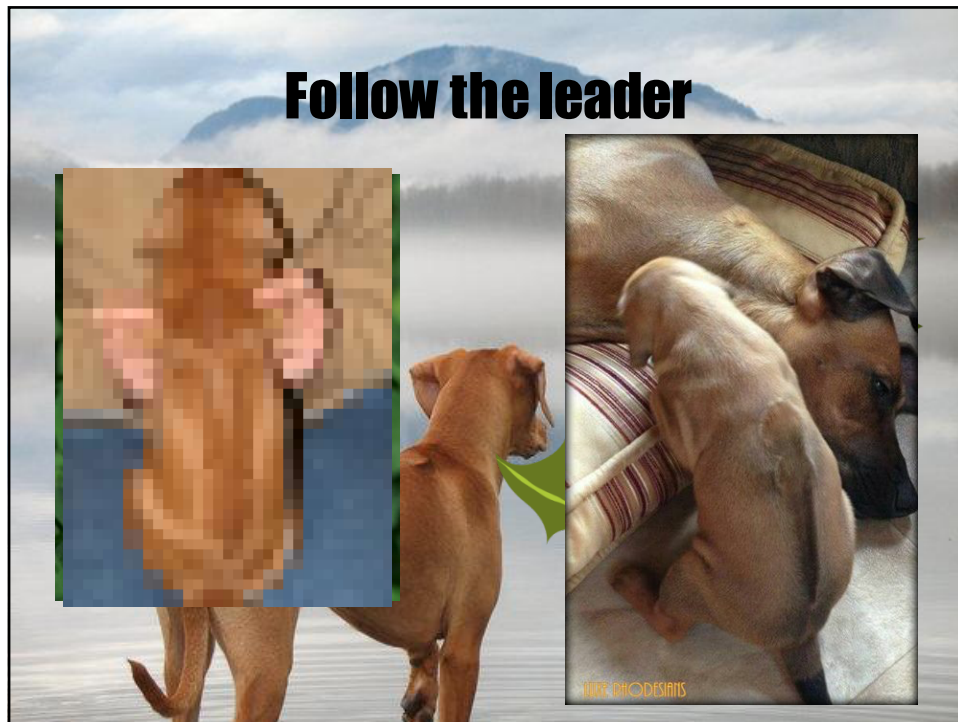
What is the purpose of the ridge?

## Subjectivity excuses no longer fly

### Subjective

- existing in the mind; belonging to the thinking subject rather than to the object of thought (opposed to *objective*).
- Pertaining to or characteristic of an individual; personal, individual: *a subject evaluation*.
- Placing excessive emphasis on one's own moods, attitudes, opinions, etc.; **unduly egocentric**.

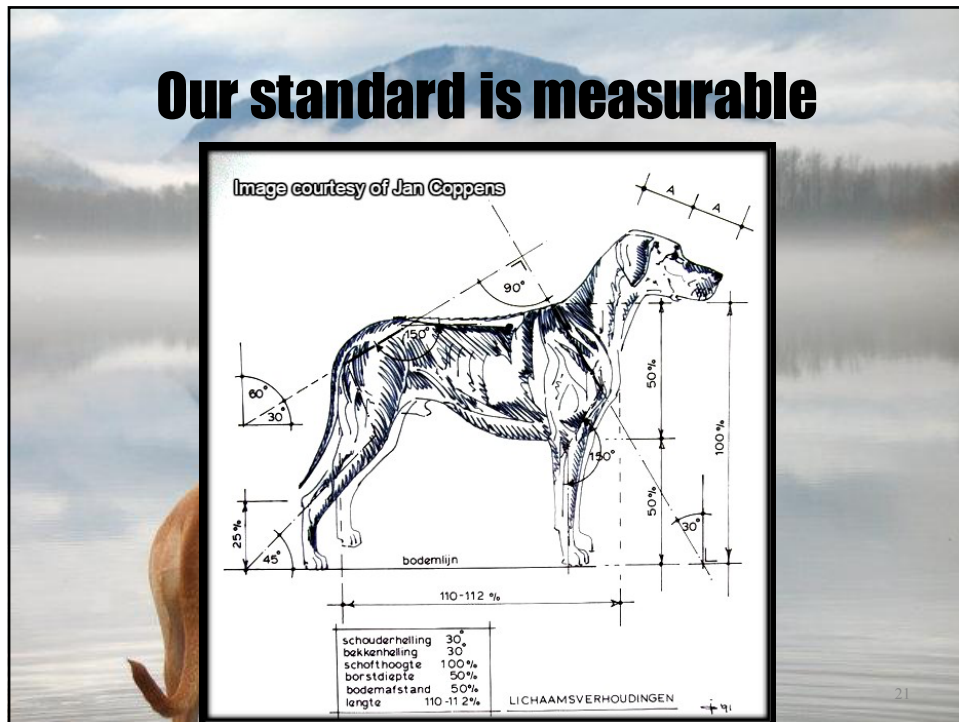
### Objective

- Being the object or goal of one's efforts or actions.

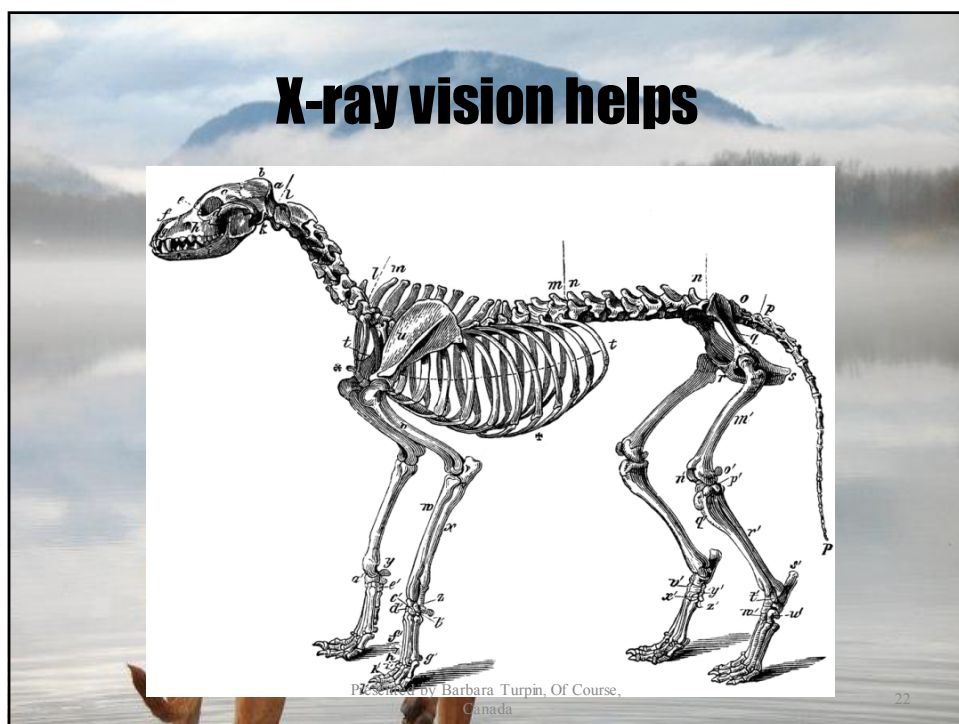

## The golden rectangle and triangle



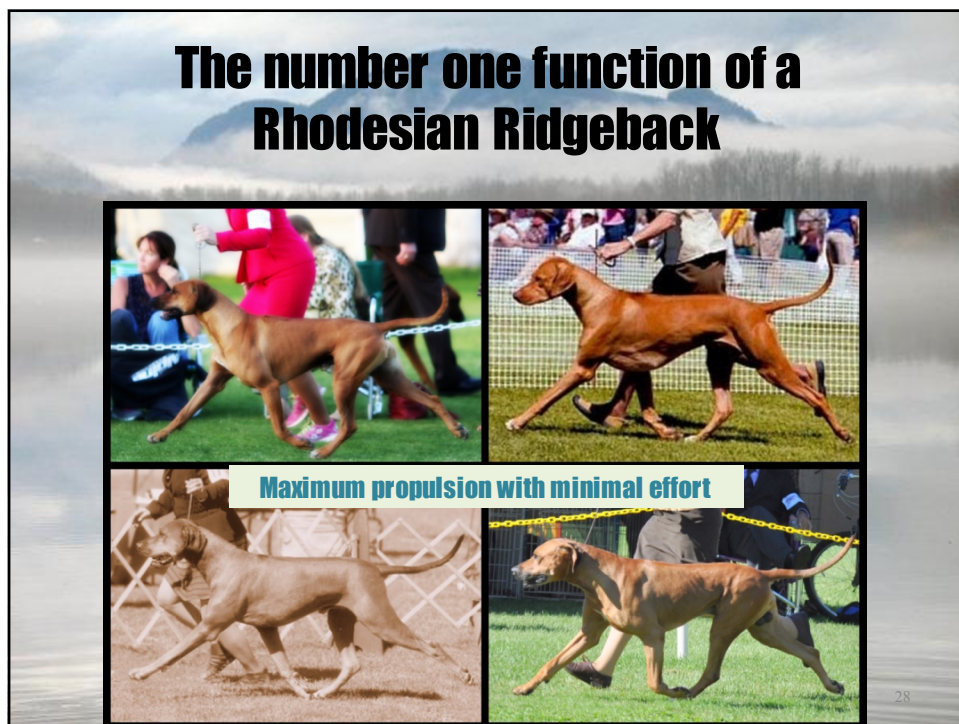
The **Golden ratio** is a special number found by dividing a line into two parts so that the longer part divided by the smaller part is also equal to the whole length divided by the longer part. It is often symbolized using phi after the 21st letter of the Greek alphabet.

A **golden rectangle** is a rectangle that can be cut up into a square and a rectangle similar to the original one. It's dimensions are based on the golden ratio. Namely, 1.618033...



a pale yellow-beige.

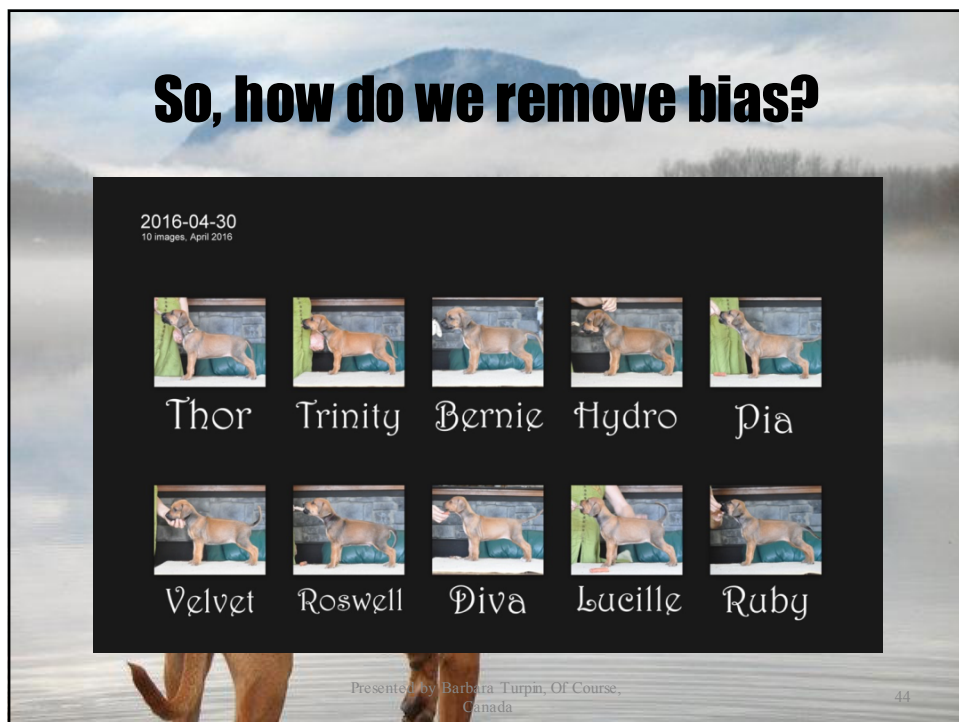
