
NKK attends the weekend at the 4th International Dog Health Workshop in Windsor, England.

During the conference, researchers, cynological interest groups and scientific organizations will shed light on and discuss issues related to the health and welfare of dogs.

After introductory lectures, participants are divided into groups for deeper discussions. The goal of the working groups is to find out where the shoe is pushing and to propose measures that can make a change.

The conference includes: veterinarians, geneticists, behavioral specialists, exterior judges and regular dog owners represented. There are about 130 participants in the work shop, and these represent among others. a. The United States, Canada, Australia, Israel and a number of European countries.

The Nordic countries are regarded as pioneers




Along with England, the Nordic countries have already boasted of being a pioneer in health work and the development of health plans.
